Program: State Senator Brandon Creighton - Updates from the State Capitol and report on a committee hearing this week on the issues of DEI on college campuses, antisemitism on college campuses, and campus free speech.

Raised on a working ranch in Montgomery County, where he currently resides, Brandon Creighton put himself through the University of Texas and Oklahoma City law school working as a pipefitter. Following law school, Brandon worked for the Oklahoma and Texas Attorneys General.

During his time in the Texas House, Creighton led the largest Republican Caucus in the nation, and in the Texas Senate, he Chairs the Senate Committee on Education overseeing K-12 and Higher Education.

Last election cycle, Brandon was asked to lead the statewide Victory effort for the Republican Party of Texas. Best known for his trademark, Let Texas Run Texas, Creighton is consistently ranked the most conservative in the Texas Senate. In the private sector, he works as an attorney and real estate developer in Conroe where he lives with his family.

We began the month of April with a balance forward of \$121,547. We brought in income of \$2,250 (Dues \$349, Ways & Means (Fundraiser) \$1,694, Ways & Means (Gift Ta-

ble) \$207. Expenditures totaled \$1,970 (Administrative \$886, Communications \$210, Community Engagement \$129, Hospitality \$395, Membership (Dues to TFRW) \$350). Our balance on hand as of April 30, 2024 was \$121,827.

MINUTES OF THE MAY 1 MEETING - Mary Osborn, Recording Secretary

Leigh Billingsley, President, called the May Meeting of the North Shore Republican Women to order at 11:00 AM on May 1, 2024



The devotion and the prayer were led by Cheryl Bolt and the pledges to the United States and Texas flags were led by Will Metcalf, State Representative, District 16. The minutes from the April meeting were approved as presented.

2nd Vice President Genette Stanton thanked Gail McKinnon for her help when she was on vacation and announced that we have 232 members and 66 associate members. She also reminded everyone that they could fill out their membership on line or fill out the form at the gift table. Treasurer Chris Gurley presented the financial report and our balance on hand is \$121,86.74.

3rd Vice President, Deborah Graham thanked several people for their help on the Golf Tournament, including Theresa Ross, who is helping with the On-Line auction, Diane Campbell with the banquet set up, Ann Kate with the website for the event. She asked that Sponsorships be finalized by May 30 and announced that items have been donated for the on-line auction which will run from September 1 4 to September 28 and that the silent auction at the banquet will close at 6:30 PM.

President Leigh Billingsley read a list of the candidates that will receive a donation from NSRW, including the Sheriff's race which will be paid after the runoff. The total of the donations comes to \$48,500. A vote was taken by the membership to approve this amount and the list of names and it passed.

Leigh Billingsley announced that the members of the board and the chairman of the committees that will serve on the nominating committee for the 2025 year are, Ann Kate, Carolyn Jones and Genette Stanton. She asked for nominations from the floor for two persons from the general membership. The persons nominated were Toni Sellers and Mary Frances Doris. A vote was taken by the membership and the two were approved for the nominating committee.

3rd Vice President and Scholarship committee chairperson, Deborah Graham, introduced the winner of the 2024 scholarship, Jace Yarborough from Willis High School. Jace is 7th in his class of 600 plus students and will be entering Baylor University this fall. He also received a certificate from Representative Will Metcalf to receive the flag that is being flown today at the Capital in Austin. Jace attended the luncheon with his Mother, Grandmother and his Aunt.

Will Metcalf gave a reminder that election day is Saturday May 4th and that we will be voting on an item that was
